What a huge blessing to know the Lord was feeding His sheep through our obedience.

The year has come to a close and 2019 is rapidly moving ahead. As we shared with the inmates in our first couple of services already this year; instead of making new year's resolutions of what we want to do or what we want to accomplish, may we turn our focus to the Lord and ask Him, "Lord, what is Your word for me this year?" (and / or) "Lord, what would You have me do for You this year?" For whatever you do in word or deed, do all...

Dear Friends,

Dear Friends,

For the last several months we have been having vehicle issues. Sometimes we wonder why the Lord delays in answering prayer for direction in the situation, and yet, He ALWAYS has a plan. Because of the vehicle situation, we have had to do some switching around with our regular prison services. Yet, the Lord is using this seeming delay for His glory. We do Bible study with a small group of inmates, on a weekday, as one of our regular services. This small group of men have been wanting us to come on a Sunday night to do their regular church service, but we could not because we were already in another facility. Because the Lord IS in control of this delay, He opened the door for us to go on a Sunday night. He laid on Jay's heart a bold and direct message for the big group that was much needed. He preached on being real with God – not being a “professor” of Christ but being a “possessor” (committed follower) of Christ. He told them that God is not interested in how high you jump in the service but how straight you walk when you land on your feet. The Lord had the men's attention! At the end of the service, when Jay gave the invitation for men to come to Christ, seven men responded!

How awesome is our loving and merciful God! Matthew 25: 36c & 40 says, “I was in prison, and ye came unto Me.....And the King shall answer and say unto them, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these My brethren, ye have done it unto Me.” And Hebrews 6:10 says, “For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labor of love, which ye have showed toward His name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister.”

Friends, thank you for being a part of ministering to those who are in prison for Jesus sake. God hears your prayers and sees your financial gifts and He will not forget your labor of love. You have a huge part in helping us continue to go visit and minister, to and for the Lord, behind the razor wire and cinder-block walls.

Dear Friends,

A couple of verses that Jay has been sharing with the men this month are...2 Corinthians 10:4-5, "For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds; Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ." Also, Romans 8:28-29, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose....to be conformed to the image of His Son".

We share these verses with you as the backdrop for what happened in one of the prison facilities. After preaching the Word in sweltering (almost triple digit) heat, the guard accidentally locked himself out of the room and had to go the long way around to get back in. The Lord used this "accident". Because of the delay, a new inmate to this facility pulled Jay aside asking for prayer for the Lord to help him tear down some strongholds in his life. He had been transferred from a Florida prison to serve a 30+ year sentence here in Virginia. This man has only been a Christian about 13 months. However, instead of focusing on the long term sentence he was facing here, he was smiling with his focus being on growing closer to the Lord. He asked Jay if he would take the time to pray with him, because the Lord through the message preached that night showed him some strongholds in his life that he needed to deal with. Jay, along with some of the other brothers, gathered around him and spent the "extra" time praying with and for him.

There are no "accidents" with God. He does use all things, "good and bad", for His purpose of molding His children more and more into the image of Jesus. Not only did the Lord move that night in this man's heart and life; the Lord also drew 2 men in for salvation....their journey with Him just beginning!

Another quick praise report to share with you....

Through the donations of multiple people, we were able to take 483 books and 60 pamphlets to a chaplain, who is not only a chaplain of one state prison facility but also 2 county jails, to be used in these 3 facility's libraries. We praise the Lord for these donated resources. We know the Lord will use these to be a blessing to all who take advantage of their time in prison to learn more about Him and / or draw closer to Him.

Thank you all for whatever role you have in partnering with us and the Lord in this ministry.

Dear Friends,

Bitterness! It's a hard task-master. Like the ivy plant that will fill in every "nook and cranny" it can find, so bitterness does not stay in one corner of a person's heart. It infiltrates other areas till it consumes every area of a person's life.

In ministry, we see and minister to many whose lives have been consumed with bitterness. Once that root takes hold, only through the power of Jesus working in a person's life can that root be dug up to set a person free. Elizabeth was able to share her own story of going through a time of anger and bitterness towards God (many years ago) with several groups (prison and churches) this month. Men and women alike, with tears in their eyes, thanked her saying various things such as...."thank you for sharing what you did cause that's exactly where I am at right now" ...and..."thank you, what a blessing, I needed to hear that".

A couple of verses that Jay has been sharing with the men are John 8:31-32 "Then Jesus said...If ye continue in My word, then are ye My disciples indeed; And ye shall know the Truth, and the Truth shall make you free." As well as John 14:6 "Jesus saith unto him, I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life..." As Jay tells the men --- Jesus proclaims that He is the Truth and looking back at what He already said about the Truth ---- when we continue to follow Him and know Him more and more, He (Jesus aka: The Truth) will set us free. This is what Elizabeth proclaimed to the people – it was Jesus who showed her the root of bitterness (even while serving Him) that had taken hold and it was Jesus, Who through His Word, took His big strong but gentle hands to help her dig up that root and set her free.

Dear family in Christ, there are many stories of Jesus setting people free from the prison of bitterness. Inmates are no exception. We have met many inmates who are freer locked up than scores of people walking around "free" on the outside. It is through your partnership with us that we are enabled to go into the prisons and proclaim liberty to the captives. We thank you! And as we, in gratitude to our Lord Jesus for the great things He has done, continue to say it is all.....

Dear Friends,

At the beginning of this year, we prayed asking the Lord what He wanted us to focus on regarding ministry direction for 2018. His response was, "Feed My sheep." (John 15:15-17)

For most of our years in ministry (especially the early years), our focus has been on evangelism. The Lord blessed His Word and many came to Christ. However, in the last roughly 7 years, Department of Corrections changed the way they processed the men entering the system. Up until that time, almost every man who entered the penal system started at 1 or 2 particular prisons. This was a wide open door from the Lord to catch men just starting their prison sentence when they were scared and searching for answers. We had the awesome privilege to go in and share the gospel openly and plainly, watching the Lord draw scores of men to Himself. Since the change in DOC every facility now has the means of processing the men themselves. Because of this change, instead of casting the net for a large catch of fish, it is like using a fishing pole, catching one at a time. God is still at work and men are still responding to His call to "Come".

Since the Lord's instruction at the beginning of the year, we have been seeing His sheep feasting on the pure, refreshing, green grass of His Word that He has entrusted to us. We are seeing the believer's encouraged to press in closer to the Lord and a renewed fervor in being bolder in their witness to the other inmates. Jay has said so many times, "Healthy sheep reproduce sheep". We are seeing many new men coming to the services. You can see it in their expressions; they are curious and want to hear about this Jesus that their fellow inmates are talking about and have found so much Peace in.

3 John 7&8 says, "Because that for His name's sake they went forth, taking nothing of the Gentiles. We therefore ought to receive such, that we might be fellow helpers to the Truth."

Our dear prayer partners and supporters.....Per the Lord's instructions, we have gone forth and you have been and are our fellow helpers in the Truth. We say thank you. Our teamwork is all....

March 2018

Our Dear Family in Christ,

We thank you for your prayers on behalf of Jay and the Foundation for Hope missions team as they traveled and ministered to the people of Romania. The Lord answered your prayers and blessed their trip. Here are a few highlights we would like to share with you....

The Oradea jail – This was Jay’s 5th time to go into this facility. He was told before they went in that the men who would be at the service were believers and they had planned on doing communion with them. The message God had already laid on Jay’s heart was one of self examination, so it went perfect. In the message, Jay asked them, “What kind of fruit are you producing?” He emphasized with them that what is on the inside WILL come out. Jesus said “by their fruit you will know them”. The men listened intently. Through the interpreter, several of them thanked him for the message saying it was just what they needed.

Gypsy villages – A Romanian told the team that the term gypsy means “untouchable” and this is exactly how they are treated. The gypsy people are very poor and they respond very well to outsiders who come and are not afraid to touch them – whether with a handshake, a hug, or a kiss on the cheek (which is the customary greeting). The team went from house to house inviting the people to a church service centrally located in the village. For each family that comes to the service, they are given a basic first aid type kit and a loaf of fresh bread (it is rare to find a loaf of bread in most gypsy villages). One day the team went to 3 villages with two of them having no facility to assemble in. Amidst frigid temperatures and falling snow, the people gathered in a yard to hear the Word of God. What a blessing it was to see people come out and stand in the bad weather to hear the team sing praises to God and hear the Word of God preached.

In one village, God sent Jay specifically to a man he had met last year who could not make it to the service because he was in so much pain. With the help of a guide and an interpreter, they found him. All this man had to cover his feet in the frigid wet snow were thin ankle high rubber galoshes with nothing else to protect his aching feet. Jay was able to minister to this man one on one by encouraging him in his faith. This man trusts God for his basic needs – food and shelter. Jay quoted James 2:5 “...hath God not chosen the poor of this world to be rich in faith...” He told this man that there are many in this world that see themselves as self sufficient and are rich in material things, but it is faith and dependence upon God that is true wealth and he was much wealthier than many. Before they left, they prayed with him, gave him a kit, a loaf of bread, and a pair of socks.

In another village, Jay was asked specifically (by a Romanian pastor) to share his testimony with the older youth / teenage boys, who were starting to get into trouble. Each one of them was focused on what he shared, listening to how Jesus had changed his life. The gospel went forth and even though none of them indicated a decision to follow Christ, seeds were planted and watered that day.

Jay relapsed into bronchitis while there, but praise the Lord, with the aid of a doctor and three days of rest, he was able, on their last day there, to go with the hospice doctor to visit with several of his patients. All of the patients they visited that day had already professed faith in Jesus Christ. But, what a blessing it was to offer them comfort and assurance that to be absent from this body IS to be present with the Lord. We win no matter what. One man, Davito, it was his 79th birthday that day. Jay along

with the hospice doctor and another man in his 70's from the American team (with terminal cancer) all sang Happy Birthday to him. He was all smiles when they left. Visiting with another man, they sang "God is so Good" in Romanian. He cried. God's precious Spirit had touched and blessed his heart knowing he would see the Lord face to face very soon.

Our dear prayer partners and supporters,

Because you are faithful in helping us continue to be available to minister in preaching the Word of God, visiting the sick, conducting Bible studies, discipling and encouraging younger believers here – not only in the prisons, but the hospitals, nursing homes, and individuals homes in our community....you allow us (Jay specifically) to be available for these trips to Romania. No matter where or to whom God sends us, you have a part in what God accomplishes in the hearts and lives of every individual He sends us to. We thank you.

Jay then pointed to his chest and said; "Now he lives in you." Again the man exclaimed; "I feel Him in here!" (as he patted his chest) What a wonderful and absolutely amazing God we serve!!

1 Corinthians 3:9 says, "For we are laborers together WITH God..." That is...us along with you (our ministry prayer partners and/or supporters) are working – not just us by ourselves but all of us together (as a team) working with God to share Jesus with the lost. We thank you for standing shoulder to shoulder with us to reach out, not only to the prisoners, but anyone the Lord brings across our path or sends us to.

Lord willing, Jay will be heading to Romania March 12th thru the 23rd with another ministry (Foundation for Hope) to share Jesus with several poor gypsy villages, an orphanage, as well as be a part of the ministry team to share at a pastor's conference. Jay (separately from the rest of the team) will have the additional privilege to once again be allowed into the Oradea jail to share the gospel with the inmates and to go with a hospice doctor to visit his patients and share Jesus with them. He has also been asked to speak to one group of gypsy teenagers who are starting to get into trouble. Please keep them all in your prayers that the Lord will bless His word and give fruit for their labor. Thank you.

Jan 2018 Newsletter

Many of you expressed how much you enjoyed last month's newsletter with highlights from the last 20 years of ministry. A few, with a quirky sense of humor, wondered if they should call us since some of the highlighted persons mentioned had gone home to be with Lord. We laughed saying, "No, we are not the angels of death." Ha...ha...ha... We simply had the wonderful privilege of showing them the way to Jesus with none of us realizing how close to stepping over into eternity they were. This month we thought we would share a few more highlights with you.

Shortly after we stepped out into full time ministry, Jay submitted his testimony to the Christian radio drama "Unshackled!" (which airs in multiple countries around the world thru Pacific Garden Mission in Chicago, IL). They aired his testimony (under different a name) in two parts. The lady who oversaw the project, called us shortly after it had aired to tell us, "Whatever you are going through right now, whatever attacks from the enemy you have endured, I want you to know it has been worth it. After 250 emails, phone calls, and letters, we have lost count of the number of people who have contacted us asking for someone to minister to them." Praise the Lord!

Mother's Day 2009 at a prison service, Elizabeth shared with the men Isaiah 49:15&16 "Can a woman forget her sucking child, that she should not have compassion on the son of her womb? Yea, they may forget, yet will I not forget thee. Behold, I have graven thee upon the palms of My hands " She told the men that whether they have a relationship with their mother or not, God loved them and He does not forget them. He loved them so much that Jesus paid the penalty for our sins and wants a relationship with each of us. In response, one of the inmate leaders stood and said, "Sister Elizabeth, Matthew 12:50 says, 'For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in heaven, the same is my brother, and sister, and mother.' You being faithful to be here every month, doing the will of the Father, you have been a mother to us. Happy Mother's Day!" With that said, the men (a gymnasium 2/3 full) stood to their feet, clapped and shouted, "HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY".

In prison ministry, we are exposed to many different cultures. One of these cultures is urban. When we conduct church services in prison, we lead the men in a few songs then Jay preaches. One inmate in particular, yes....one from the urban culture, with a big smile, told Elizabeth that he realized all he knew was rap and did not know how to actually sing, but he loved our music and was trying to sing with us. He and his buddy both wrote rap (what they knew) to share the gospel with their peers. A few weeks before they were released, they wrote a rap song that included lyrics about us sharing Jesus with them, how grateful they were, and rapping to the others to give their lives to Him. Don't you just love the way God uses us in our individuality for His honor and glory?

One service Elizabeth shared the crucifixion and the thief on his "death-bed" who in his final hours received salvation. She told the men it was not too late for that thief and it was not too late for them. Several prayed to receive Christ that night. Afterwards, a small framed Hispanic man, one who had prayed to receive salvation, approach her and in his very broken English said, "Thank you for sharing about the thief. That is what I am and you let me know that it wasn't too late for me." With a smile on his face, peace in his heart, and a bounce in his step, he went back to his cell a new creation in Christ!

One night we noticed that especially while we were singing and then some when Jay was preaching, an inmate was leaning up against the wall with his eyes closed almost as if he were asleep. He had done this before but that night it was more obvious. After the service, he made a “bee-line” for us to tell us, “I want you to know that I wasn’t sleeping during the service. You just bring such a Peaceful Spirit with you, especially when you are singing, that for the brief time you are here, I am transported out of prison into a peaceful place. Thank you!”

In each of these highlights, we know it was God’s Spirit who was touching these men’s hearts. We are blessed to simply be Christ’s ambassadors. We always pray before going through any door the Lord has opened, whether it be a prison service, a hospital, a nursing home, a person’s home, a church, etc. “Lord, You know what is needed, we don’t. Help us to be sensitive to Your Spirit and speak through us. May Jesus be seen, not Jay and Elizabeth, and may You alone be glorified.” God has honored this prayer, for we have watched Him birth many, many souls into His family. We have prayed with those who have – or – are crying out to the Lord for His intervention. We have heard the grateful believer’s praising God for encouraging their hearts to continue pressing on and draw even closer to Him. And, we can’t begin to count the number of people (both incarcerated and free) who have said, “Thank you. That is exactly what I needed to hear from the Lord today.” We stand in awe and praise Him for what He has done, what He is doing and what He will do in the future.

As with our last update, there are so many more stories we could tell you.....things He has done. We thank you for your prayers, your words of encouragement, and / or your financial support. We each in the body of Christ have a job to do. Thank you for standing with us in sharing Jesus with so many.
